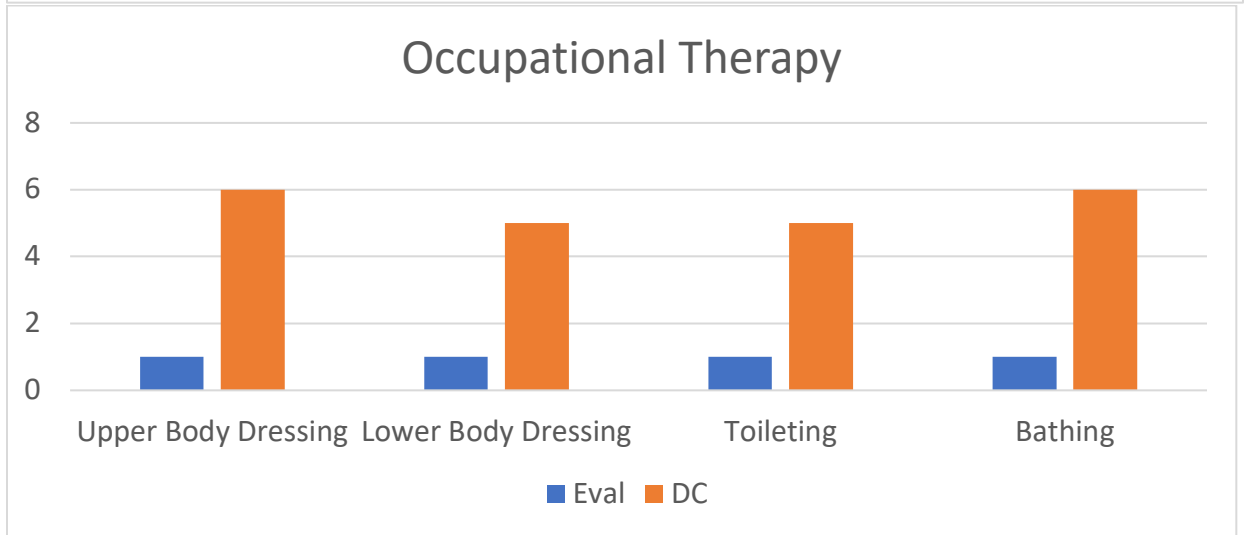
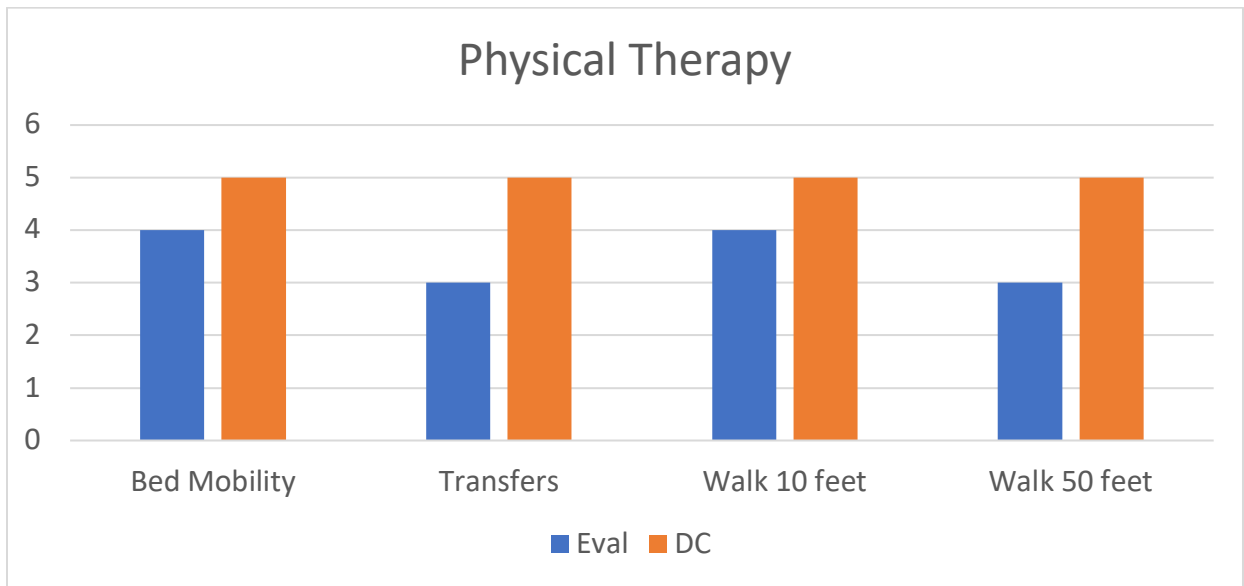




Virginia Banda is an 85-year-old female who had a fall at home and admitted to Memorial Herman Northeast on 7/11/2024. Upon admission she was also found to have Bacteremia, with a history of encephalopathy, liver cirrhosis, and HTN. Virginia Banda was treated for her conditions and discharged to Deerbrook Skilled Nursing and Rehab on 7/18/2024.

On 7/20/2024, Mrs. Banda was evaluated by Physical Therapy. The initial assessment indicated that she required minimal assistance for bed mobility. Moderate assistance for transfers and minimal assistance for 20 feet of ambulation, using a two wheeled walker. The Occupational Therapy assessment indicated that she required total assistance for upper body dressing, lower body dressing, toileting and bathing. Both OT and PT created individualized plans of care to help Mrs. Banda improve her mobility and activities of daily living for the following 20 days of skilled therapy.

Upon discharge, Mrs. Banda demonstrated significant improvements in her functional mobility and ability to perform activities of daily living. She improved her bed mobility and transfers to stand by assistance and setup assistance. She is also able to ambulate 300 feet stand by assistance using a two wheeled walker. She improved her self-care skills, requiring setup assistance for upper body dressing, as well as contact guard assistance for lower body dressing. She improved her toileting to contact guard assistance and bathing to setup assistance. With improved mobility and requiring less physical assistance, Virginia Banda was able to discharge home safely with family on 8/16/2024.



MDS Section GG Functional Scores	
06 - Independent	Completes the activity by him/herself with no assistance from a helper
05 - Setup or clean-up assistance	Helper sets up or cleans up; patient completes activity. Helper assists only prior to or following the activity.
04 - Supervision or touching assistance	Helper provides verbal cues and/or touching/steadying and/or contact guard assistance as patient completes activity. Assistance may be provided throughout the activity or intermittently.
03 - Partial/moderate assistance	Helper does LESS THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts, holds, or supports trunk or limbs, but provides less than half the effort.
02 - Substantial/maximal assistance	Helper does MORE THAN HALF the effort. Helper lifts or holds trunk or limbs and provides more than half the effort.
01 - Dependent	Helper does ALL of the effort. Patient does none of the effort to complete the activity. Or the assistance of 2 or more helpers is required for the patient to complete the activity.
